The Torske Klub starts 2007 with an excellent program as we are privileged to have as our guest Lt. Col. David James, representing the "Red Tail Project", Americas Tribute to the Tuskegee Airmen. The Tuskegee Airmen were the first African Americans to be trained as WWII Military pilots in the U.S. Army Air Corps. They challenged America's racist attitudes with the willingness to give their lives to a country not willing to acknowledge them. There were 992 pilots trained at Tuskegee, Alabama while over 10,000 Black maintenance personnel



trained at Chanute field in Illinois. To identify themselves, they painted the tails of their aircraft red, thus becoming the "Red Tails". The Tuskegee Airmen "Red Tails" carried their hopes and dreams of equality for themselves and their thirteen million African American countrymen into battle. Thanks to Gene Kaszmarek for his participation in arranging this program.

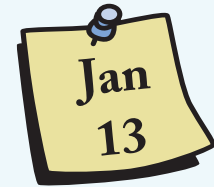
Last Month

Andy Andersen - Trophy Winning Ski Jumper

Our good friend and long time Torske Klub member, Andy Andersen, has had a very distinguished second career as a prize winning ski jumper.

Andy, born May 25, 1918 in Lillesand, Norway, won his first ski jumping contest at the age of six! Andy says that his earliest memories were on skies and snow. During the German occupation of Norway the Nazis' knocked on his door looking for skiers and skis. At the risk of being shot, Andy told them that he could no longer ski and had no skis. He had hidden his four pairs of skis in the attic loft under many pairs of blankets.

Andy moved to Chicago in 1948 and joined his brother who had moved here in the early 1930's. Andy worked as a carpenter with his brother's company building wooden bridges and boardwalks. He mar-

ried his sweetheart, Margrethe from Hjelmeland near Stavanger, in 1955 and with her raised their family.

In 1954, the Norge Ski Klub erected another one of their legend-ski-jump scaffolds in Chicago's Soldiers Field. Our member, Andy Andersen, won 1st Prize for his jumps - three days in a row! Andy is pictured above with those ver trophies. Andy says the scariest moments of his life occurred while standing at the top of those jumps at Soldiers Field. The wind was blowing so hard that scaffold was swaying six feet from side to side!

Andy's last jump was in Fox River Grove at the Norge Ski Jump in 1956. That day he won 1st Prize in his Class.

The Torske Klub is proud to have Andy Andersen as one of our members - a true Viking and ski-jumping champion!
